OUR FOUNDER

Dr. E. Uner Goodman of Bondville, Vermont, cofounder of the Order of the Arrow, has devoted his

lifetime to the welfere and training of American boys and men.

In 1915, at the age of 24, he and Carrol Edson founded the Order of the Arrow which has

become the National Honor Comping Society of the Boy Scouts of america. At the time, Urner was

camp director of Treasure Island Scout Camp.
He became Scout Executive at Philadelphia Council
and later held the same position in Chicago.

He was the first National Director of the Program Division of the Boy Scouts of America, serving in that caracity from 1931 to 1951. While he was Director of the Division, the Cub, Scout and Explorer Programs, were given to the nation. Much of the literature and visual aids came into being under his leadership.

Dr. Goodman's Scouting career began as a volunteer leader in 1911. He has always maintained a personal contact with boys in a volunteer capacity.

Although he retired from profrssional service in 1951, he continues as a National Field Commissioner a member of the National Council and several committees. Heve you ever thought that professional Scouting might be for you? Today there are over 3,700 men giveng full time career leadership to Scouting throughout the country. Four hundred qualified new men needed each year.






Upon retiring from professional Scouting, Dr. Goodman entered into the service of his church. He became the first general director of the United Church Men of America, National Counil of Churches.
