To apply for Brotherhood membership, you must complete the yellow Brotherhood card and give it to Bob Hartman at the April Ordeal. A written statement of 100 to 200 words or more regarding your rededication to the principle of Cheerful Service to Fellowmen is also required.

We are working toward a goal of 50% of eligible membership being Brotherhood. SO IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE, BE AT THE APRIL ORDEAL.

Those who plan to take part in the Brotherhood ceremony in April please be advised that you must pay \$1.35 for your Brotherhood sash to the Brotherhood Chairman no later than Saturday morning of the Ordeal weekend. This fee is apart form the usual weekend fee for food.
