

ELECTION TIME NEARS

It is about time for us to start thinking about who will be the Lodge Officers
next year. As you know, elections will
be held at the Lodge Business Meeting on Sunday morning of the upcoming April Ordeal Weekend.

This year there will be a run-off election between the two Vice - Chiefs, Dave Benedict and Matt Christenson, for the office of Chief. There will also be elections for two Vice - Chiefs, Lodge Corresponding Secretary, Lodge Recording Secretary, and Lodge Treasurer. A Trustee election will also be held. To be elected are three trustees, two boys and one adult, for the term ending April, 1975.

Briefly, the duties of the officers are:

<u>Vice-Chiefs</u>: Coordinators of Unit Elections;
coordinators of annual Fall Fellowship; responsible for the carrying on of the Chief's

duties in his absence.

Corresponding Secretary: Editor of the Lodge newsletter, the Wulamoc; responsible for answering all Lodge directed mail and for maintaining a profitable exchange of information and ideas with the other lodges in Area III-A.

Recording Secretary: Records and publishes the minutes of all Lodge Executive Committee and Business meetings; responsible for the records of individual member's service and participation; keeps records on all Lodge events and keeps the Lodge history up to date.

Treasurer: Works closely with his advisor to receive and disburse the funds of the Lodge; responsible for the inventory and sale of all Lodge patches and insignia; responsible for keeping accurate membership records and issuing membership cards.

All Ordeal Members who have met the Brotherhood requirements by April 28 will have a chance to BECOME A BROTHERHOOD MEMBER of our Lodge, at the upcoming April Ordeal Weekend, to be held April 28 - 30, 1972. The Brotherhood Honor seals your membership in the Order of the Arrow.

The requirements are these:
1. Active Registration in Scouting.

2. Active Registration in Octoraro Lodge.

(dues MUST be paid)

3. Ten month's active service as an Ordeal member (thus you are eligible if you were inducted last June or before)

a. Have shown a continued interest in the

Scouting and camping program.

b. Service to the Order through 3 service weekends and/or workdays and 2 service

projects.

Note of explanation for part b: You can count the upcoming April Ordeal Weekend as well as the one at which you took your Ordeal -- and if you do this, you need only one more weekend or workday. A service project must be one performed in the name of the Lodge -- other than Ordeal Weekends or Workdays; such as participation in the Saturday night campfire ceremonies put on by OA members at Horseshoe, attendance at the Annual Banquet, being a Line Leader or Assistant Line Leader at an Ordeal, or participation in an OA degree or tap-out team.

4. Written Statement of 100 to 200 words or more regarding your rededication to the principles of Cheerful Service to Fellowmen.
5. Satisfactory Answers to all questions in

the questionnaire, including the memorization of the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow, and the song "Firm Bound in Brotherhood".

(You were given the Brotherhood Questionnaire when you received your O/A Handbook and patch at your Ordeal. The yellow brotherhood card mentioned in the next paragraph was also given to you then. If you need either or both, they are available from the Council Service Center, 504 S. Concord Rd., West Chester, Pa. 19380)

To apply for Brotherhood Membership, you must complete the yellow brotherhood card and send it to the Council Service Center or Bob Hartman, Brotherhood Chairman, NO LATER THAN April 20, or give it to Bob at the April Or-

Those who plan to take part in the Brotherhood Ceremony in April, please be advised that you MUST pay \$1.35 for your Brotherhood sash, to the Brotherhood Chairman no later than Saturday Morning of the Ordeal Weekend. This fee is apart from the usual weekend fee for food.

The purpose of this program is to get an accurate representation of the background, likes, and opinions of our membership in order to planactivities in the best way possible. The committee reported back at the March meeting with the completed questionnaire form which will be distributed at the next 2 Ordeals. This new project is quite important to the Lodge and your cooperation will be appreciated.

1972 AREA CONFERENCE TO BE HELD JUNE 16-18

AT BROAD CREEK RESERVATION

This year the Area III-A Conference will be held at the Broad Creek Scout Reservation of the Baltimore Area Council near Darlington, Md. from Friday, June 16th to Sunday, June 18th. Nentico Lodge # 12 is the host for this years conference which will include discussion sessions relating to lodge activities and the Order of the Arrow as well as like interest groups, ceremonies and sport competitions and recreation.

Octoraro Lodge has a quota of 24 boy delegates. Members of the lodge, under 21 years of age, regardless of their degree or position in the lodge are eligible to make application as a delegate. The cost is \$7.00 per person but the lodge will reimburse one half of the conference fee to any delegate who makes a written report of the conference by August 1st. Transportation and insurance will be provided by Octoraro Lodge.

THE OCTORARO TRADER

To start off, the Octoraro Trader would like to apologize to any and all persons offended by the reference to the mysterious mistake maker in the last issue. The issue with red nails was indeed a manufacturer's error.

One of the best activities that a patch trader, or anyone, can attend is a National Jamboree. In addition to the regular Jamboree program, there are always areas set aside for trading. Tents and tables are set up through out the Jamboree where you can trade almost anything. Jamborees have been a part of Scouti-

ing since 1935.

The first Jamboree was scheduled for 1935 and was to be held in Washington. D.C. but was canceled due to a flu epidemic. The patch had a picture of the capitol on it. The Jamboree was rescheduled for 1937 and again for Washington. This was the first real Jamboree held in the United States. The patch was round with the Washington Monument on it. This patch and the Jamboree Neckerchief are very valuable. The patch is felt embroidered. 34,000 scouts attended the Jamboree.

The next Jamboree was not held until 1950. This one was held at Valley Forge. There were two patches issued at this Jamboree, one was a flimsy canvas patch with a silk screened design. The other was a regular woven patch which was to be sent out to the participants after the Jamboree. Each scout who attended received two of the second, and better quality patches. These patches depicted George Washington kneeling. There were 47.000scouts in attendance.

The next Jamboree was held in 1953 at Irvine Ranch in California. It was the first Jamboree not held on the east coast. There were 45,000 scouts in attendance at this Jamboree. The Jamboree back patch, which was the first of its kind issued, is one of the hardest Jamboree patches to get. The patch and neckerchief show a covered wagon.


In 1957, the Jamboree was brought back to the east coast, and was again held at Valley Forge Park. This Jamboree was one of the better ones as far as local patch traders are concerned since many scouts from our Council attended. The patch again showed George Washington kneeling with the words "Onward for God and my Country" around part of the inside circle. 52,000 scouts attended this Jamboree which was the first where leather back patches were isued.

Three years later, in 1960, the National Jamboree was held at Colorado Springs, Colorado. This year was the 50th Anniversary of Boy Scouting. During this year, a complete set of patches for Philmont, Schiff, Jubilee Camporees, Cub Field Days, and the Jamboree were issued, and were all of the same basic design. The Jamboree patches were gold or yellow in color and had red lettering which said "National Jamboree - Colorado Springs". This was the largest Jamboree so far with 56,000 scouts in attendance.


The Jamboree came back to Valley Forge in 1964, for the last time, due to the growing population of the area. This was the first Jamboree in history not to issue a small round patch. Instead a fully embroidered rectangular patch, showingGeorge Washington kneeling and bearing the words: "National Jamboree - 1964" was issued. There was also a rectangular silk patch issued which is valued at nearly twice as much as the embroidered patch.

The latest National Jamboree was held in 1969 at Farragut State Park in Idaho. This Jamboree had the second lowest attendance figure with only 35,000 scouts. The patch is fully embroidered with a buck in two shades of tan overlooking a lake. The forest is in two shades of green with a gold fleur-de-lis. All of this is on a gold background and is one of the best looking Jamboree designs yet.
