

If this can be accomplished, our Lodge will be only that much more ahead of the others.

## Elections Policy Adopted

At the November 1 Executive Committee meeting, an official lodge elections policy was adopted. All unit leaders will receive a copy of the policy when they are contacted concerning unit elections. The text follows:

Octoraro Lodge #22, W.W.W., is deeply concerned about the current quota system and its effects on our Lodge and the Order of the Arrow in general. We feel that the change in quotas made in 1968 to enable more qualified candidates to become members, although done

with sincere intentions of improving our organization, has in fact decreased the quality of participation of Lodge members, and thus has not had the desired result.

We base our opinion in this matter on experience and statistics that clearly reveal a substantial number of Order of the Arrow candidates turn up faithfully for their Ordeal and then are seldom, if ever, seen again at a Lodge function. Rather, it seems that these Scouts are no longer willing to dedicate themselves to the principles of our Order and therefore the quality of members' participation is deteriorating. At the present time Octoraro Lodge is powerless to change the quota system, as it is a national regulation. However, the Scoutmasters can improve this situation in several ways.

First, Octoraro Lodge strongly urges Scoutmasters when choosing candidates for election to only consider First Class Scouts or those of higher rank, as a candidate need have substantial experience in camping. (The Order of the Arrow is an honors camping or-

ganization).

Secondly, the Scoutmasters should honestly feel that each candidate put up for election is fully qualified, and that if he becomes a member he will actively serve the Order of the Arrow and Octoraro Lodge.

Taking the above into consideration, we strongly recommend that Scoutmasters only avail themselves of their full quota when they sincerely believe that they have that num-

ber of properly-qualified candidates.

Octoraro Lodge is interested in individuals who will dedicate themselves to cheerful service and improve our quality lodge. It is only through the cooperation of the Scoutmasters that our Lodge can maintain its high standards.

## Fall Ordeal And Fellowship Is A GREAT Success

Ninety-six Ordeal members were inducted at the Fall Ordeal and Fellowship Weekend held September 25, 26, and 27 at Camp Horseshoe. A total of 46 Brothers took part in the Brotherhood Cremony the same weekend.

We had visitors from Kecoughtan and Blue Heron Lodges in addition to over 350 Brothers

from our Lodge.

For the first time in Lodge history, we had a fellowship weekend in conjunction with the Ordeal. The great success of this endeavor was due to the foresight of the Lodge Executive Committee and especially the planning and work put into the job by Steve Darby , coordinator of the weekend. Most of the work projects were completed in the morning, while in the afternoon Brotherhood and Ordeal candidates worked on projects at Jubilee. The rest of the members participated in a general fellowship and games at Horseshoe. Four different teams competed for an award. All participating Brothers were given a fall fellowship patch. We hope that the members took advantage of the afternoon to get acquainted with other Brothers of our Lodge.

The highlight of the weekend was a patch auction Saturday night. Patches were donated by various Brothers who attended the weekend. Due to their generosity over \$300 was realized in what we hope will be a yearly affair.

Several of our Brothers continued their fine work on the Friday and Saturday night ceremonies. ## Winter Camp Promotion

Last year our Lodge initiated aprogram of service to the troops involved in the winter camping program at Horseshoe. For this year we are expanding the project under the leadership of Eric Lorgus, Chairman of the

Winter Camp Promotion Committee.

The idea is to get a few Order of the Arrow members down to camp each weekend of the winter season to aid the campmaster and the troops in camp. A minimum of three boys and one adult (preferably four and one) will stay in the O/A Lodge for the weekend and help provide a good program for the boys by helping with troop advancement, organizing a troop program for the weekend, arranging for religious services, a Saturday night campfire, and helping to keep the camp in good condition.

Response to the program from Scoutmasters has been encouraging, as has the willingness of our members to volunteer to help--especially at the Fall Ordeal and Fellowship Weekend. However, more help is needed, particularly for the dates January 22-24 and 29-31. Dates in the months after January are also open.

## **NEW LODGE PATCH!!**

Besides developing an elections policy for the Lodge in the past two months, your Executive Committee has been rather busy with

several different projects.

Perhaps the most important news is that at the November 1 meeting the committee UNA-NIMOUSLY APPROVED a design for A NEW LODGE POCKET FLAP PATCH which will probably be put on sale in April. The size of the patch will be larger than the present one, because it is designed to fit the pockets of the new uniforms recently introduced. There are 9 different colors in the new patch, which has a silver border. The actual design, which was developed by Harry Murvin, Jr., Ernest Heegard, and Rob Hopkins, will be reproduced in the next issue of the WULAMOC. The fully-embroidered patch will be sold for \$.75. No limit on the number you can buy, either.

Much work was accomplished at the workday held October 24 at the Council Service Center. Brush was cleared, trees pruned, the building cleaned, floors waxed, and the windows were washed by the 47 Brothers who came.

Reports have been made concerning the winter cam promotion program (see page 7), the upcoming banquet (page 9), and the bylaws revision. Voting for new bylaws will take place in June. Also, Jim Gawthrop reported that Octoraro 22 can have 2 more delegates to the 1971 Area III-A Conference.
