That is why we are asking those of you who have



Octoraro Lodge's next Ordeal Work Weekend is on April 26, 27, and 28. As you know, the Lodge inducts new members at the three ordeal weekends we hold each year. In April, approximately eighty candidates will undergo their ordeals. These eighty candidates will be divided up into about nine lines, each with a line-leader and assistant line leader.

The two Brothers who serve in these positions are responsible for the safe conduct and welfare of the candidates in their line. They see to it that the line is at the right place doing what it is supposed to be doing at the right time. Being a line leader or assistant line leader is a unique experience and shows to the Brothers acting as the line leaders that there is much more to running a safe, smooth Ordeal then meets the eye. And best of all, if you serve as a line leader or assistant, you meet another requirement for Brotherhood. And if it is the only requirement left that you needed, you get it done just like that. Brothers serving as line leaders or assistants can also become Brotherhood in the same weekend.
