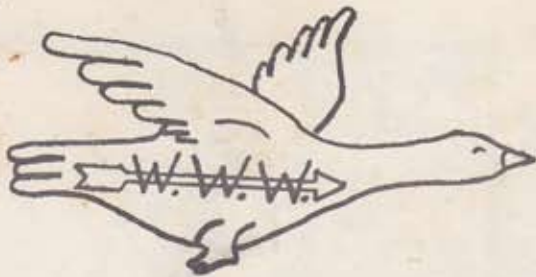

To end dropouts, let's require high school diplomas for a driver's license.


HAPPY NEW YEAR! (Let's hope it is better than 1972!) It is up to YOU!

also, they may be paid in advance at any of the THREE (3) Ordeal Weekends held each year, by contacting JOE KNIPE.

At the present time Octoraro Lodge #22's dues are:

\$2.50 per year

\$15.00 for LIFE

IF your dues ARE NOT PAID by 31st December of each year, your MAILING STENCIL WILL BE REMOVED from the records - - - thus you will no longer receive ANY Lodge Information; the Wulomac; nor be privileged to partake of any Lodge Activities

For a member who is delinquent in his dues payment it is necessary that he be REINSTATED. To be REINSTATED a member must pay one (1) years dues PLUS \$1.50 reinstatement fee, or he may pay LIFE Membership fee PLUS \$1.50.

Dues are not to be sent or left at Council Service Center.

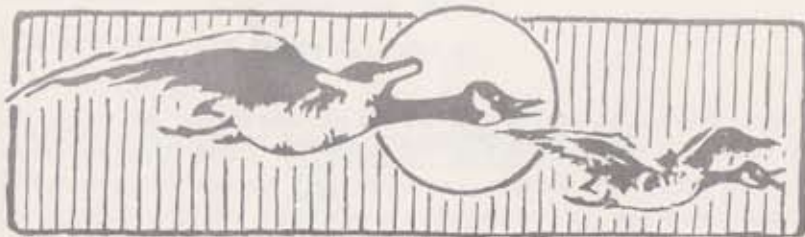
