

Among the projects of the Lodge through the years have been: The building and maintenance of the beautiful Camp Chapel and Campfire Circle. Not to be forgotten is the Lodge Ceremonial Circle, The Eagle and Scouter's Groves, the swinging bridges, the Louis Lester Memorial Bridge completed in 1968, plus numerous conservation and camp service projects completed each spring and fall.

On September 7, 1946, the Lodge Officers. degree team, and members journeyed to the Darden Scout Reservation of the Tidewater Council in Norfolk, Virginia to install and induct the first Ordeal Charter members of Lodge #349, to be known as Blue Heron Lodge. We are proud indeed to be the mother lodge of this fine group of Arrowmen from the South. Our two Lodges have continued to enjoy an exchange of outstanding friendship and fellowship throughout the past twenty-six years. Just this past fall, a delegation of our members traveled to Virginia to help our Brothers there to celebrate their 25th Anniversary.

During the year 1944 a fund was created in Octoraro Lodge for the construction of a lodge building at the Horseshoe Scout Reservation. After several years of fund raising. ground was broken in 1952. Scout Executive Lester gave tremendous backing to the Lodge and its building program. His cooperation, judgement, and counsel helped so much to make the building a reality. Continued progress was made during the camping seasons and work weekends until finally, in 1958, the building was essentially completed. Many brothers gave freely of their time, labor, and money on the project. Finally, on June 20, 1959, in a gala day long event. Octoraro Memorial Lodge was dedicated by our former Supreme Chief of the Fire. Louis Lester. The building stands today as a memorial to all of our former members who helped spread the light of Wimachtendienk, W. W. in Chester County.

LODGE HISTORY (cont'd)

On June 19, 1965, the Lodge again held a ceremony and celebration to "burn the mortgage" following the final payment of the debt on the Lodge Building.

The year 1968 marked the completion of another two year project, the new suspension bridge over the Octoraro leading to our Ceremonial Circle. The new bridge was named for "Chief" Louis Lester our beloved former Scout Executive who served in this Council from 1941 to 1957 and who passed away on June 1, 1965.

In the year 1969, Octoraro Lodge served as the host lodge for the 1969 Area III-A Conference as it had in: 1940, 1948, 1953, and 1961.

The year 1972 finds Octoraro Lodge an active working Lodge of 1200 members serving the Chester County Council and the Horseshoe Scout Reservation through our camping and service program, and anxiously looking forward to 1976 and our Golden Anniversary.

Our heartfelt thanks for your many kindnesses during the wonderful weekend. In love







PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

Planning has begun in earnest for Octoraro Lodge's 1972 - 73 year. In the process of this planning many new ideas have come up and many changes have been made, most notably in the structure of the Executive Committee. Now, each committee is under the direct supervision of a Vice-Chief, and are grouped under two general categories: Administration under Jim Matthews. and Program under Dave Bartlett. In addition, each committee has specific projects to accomplish and specific target dates by which these projects must be completed. Some of these projects are: Unit Elections: develop a Standard Operating Procedure to aid in smooth operation and develop a slide show and tape recording on the Order of the Arrow for presentation to units holding their election in order to make them more familiar with he aims of the Order. Camp Promotion: Develop a new and more extensive slide show and tape and plan to visit every troop in the council with this show. Winter Camp Promotion: Develop a Standard Operating Procedure and hold a training weekend for all crew leaders. Where to go Camping: Completely revise, update, and reprint the Lodge's Where to go Camping booklet and have this booklet ready for publication by January 1, 1973. Program: Plan and coordinate the Fall Fellowship, and begin planning for our 50th Anninversary activities and booklet for our celebration in 1976. Information for Members: Prepare an Information for Members booklet containing information concerning the Order in general and our Lodge in particular that would be of interest and help to our Members. Have this booklet ready for publication by January 1, 1973.

As you can see, the plans are very ambitious, but can easily be realized with the full support of the membership. So be sure to look forward to an ACTIVE, ENJOYABLE, and PROFITABLE

Year ahead.

WEAR 'EM RIGHT. The red and blue jac-shirts and poplin jackets are designed to be worn with specific insignia. Any other insignia attached to these jackets nutomatically makes the entire uniform unofficial and unauthorized. Authorized for the jackets: (1) The program emblem for the Scouter's branch of Scouting is worn centered on the left pocket. (2) The Philmont bull (Philmont Scout Ranch and Explorer Base) especially designed for the red jacket may be worn over the left pocket at the shoulder. (3) The Schiff Scout Reservotion, Philmont and canoe base emblems may be centered on the right pocket or in a comparable place if there is no pocket. Only one may be worn at a time. (4) Explorers may wear their special interest emblem on the right sleeve, 2 inches below the shoulder seam, OR (not both) wear the 6-inch emblem on the back of the jacket. (5) Order of the Arrow members may wear the 6-inch national OA patch centered on the back. (6) Similarly, 6-inch jamboree patches may be worn on the back. However, only one such patch (OA or jamboree) may be worn at a time. Other patches and insignia are best displayed on patch blankets, trophy hides, backpacks and camping equipment or mounted for display in other ways.
