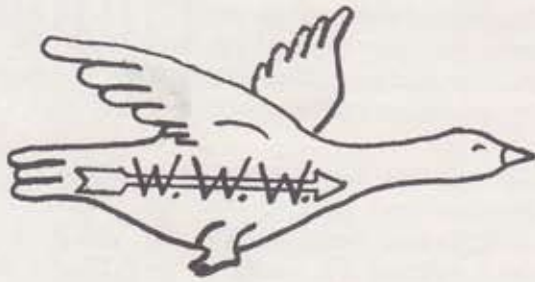

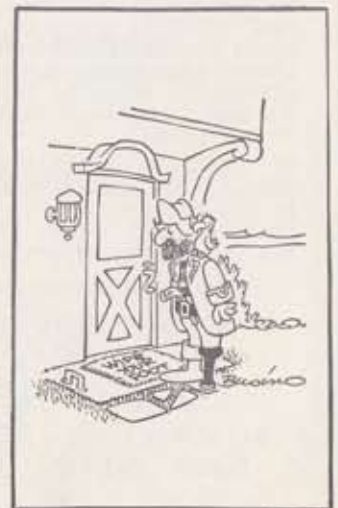

# THE FULLY BROIDERED FULLY EMBROIDERED INDUCTION

## 11 Durable Colors

(Don't get stuck with a "wooden patch"!)

The following principles, if properly understood and applied, combined with sound management practices, will guarantee successful operation of the Order of the Arrow Induction Sequence.

**I. PURPOSE OF THE INDUCTION.** THE ORDER OF THE ARROW INDUCTION SEQUENCE IS A PROCESS DESIGNED TO STIMULATE PERSONAL GROWTH. IT IS NOT A MEMBERSHIP-QUALIFYING EXAMINATION.

**II. ELIGIBILITY.** THE RIGHT TO FULL MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORDER AND THE RIGHT TO COMPLETE THE INDUCTION SEQUENCE IS GRANTED EXCLUSIVELY BY THE BOY MEMBERS OF THE HOME UNIT, AND THEIR DECISION CAN BE OVERRULED ONLY BY THE SCOUT WHOM THEY ELECTED.

**III. CANDIDATE'S COMPLIANCE.** THE CANDIDATE HAS THE CONTINUOUS CHOICE OF MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE INDUCTION TO THE BEST OF HIS ABILITY, OR WITHDRAWING.

**IV. FLEXIBILITY.** ALTHOUGH IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT THE TESTS OR REQUIREMENTS OF THE INDUCTION BE MET AS STATED IF IT IS POSSIBLE TO DO SO, THEIR LITERAL FULFILLMENT IS SUBORDINATE TO THE FULFILLMENT OF THEIR PURPOSES. THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT THE TESTS MAY BE INDISCRIMINATELY VIOLATED, BUT RATHER THAT THEY BE APPLIED ONLY TO THE EXTENT THAT THEY ACCOMPLISH THEIR OBJECTIVES.

**V. GENEROSITY.** THE ENVIRONMENT OF THE INDUCTION SEQUENCE MUST BE ONE IN WHICH THE CANDIDATE ENCOUNTERS ACCEPTANCE, RESPECT, UNDERSTANDING, SINCERITY, FRIENDLY ENCOURAGEMENT, SUPPORT, AND TRUST FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE LODGE.

**VI. MEMBER'S COMPLIANCE.** DURING THE ORDEAL, ANY MEMBER VISIBLE OR AUDIBLE TO THE CANDIDATES MUST ACT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SPIRIT OF THE TESTS, AND THE LETTER OF THE TESTS WHENEVER

POSSIBLE. HE MUST TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THE IMPRESSIONABLE CONDITION OF THE CANDIDATES, AND THE NATURE AND PURPOSES OF THE RESTRICTIONS ACCEPTED BY THEM.

**VII. IMPORTANCE OF THE INDIVIDUAL.** ALL ACTIONS AND PROCEDURES MUST RECOGNIZE THE WORTH, DIGNITY, AND SEPARATE IDENTITY OF EACH INDIVIDUAL, HIS INTELLIGENCE, AND HIS PRESENT OR POTENTIAL ABILITY TO GOVERN HIMSELF.

**VIII. CEREMONIAL INTIMATENESS.** CEREMONIAL ATMOSPHERE, ARRANGEMENT, AND PERFORMANCE MUST PROMOTE IN EACH CANDIDATE A SENSE OF HIS OWN WORTH, AND WITHIN THE CIRCLE A FEELING OF UNITY AND TOGETHERNESS. OFFICERS MUST MEMORIZE THEIR LINES, AND CONVEY IN THEIR DELIVERY THE MOOD AND MEANING OF EACH PART OF THE TEXT.

**IX. SYMBOLIC PROGRESSION.** THE LOGICAL DEVELOPMENT OF SYMBOLISM ALREADY INHERENT IN THE INDUCTION SEQUENCE MUST NOT BE DISRUPTED BY THE INTRODUCTION OF ANY ELEMENT NOT YET DISCLOSED BY THE PRESCRIBED CEREMONIES. ANY LOCAL PRACTICE MUST BE CONSISTENT WITH THE SYMBOLISM AND MEANING OF THESE CEREMONIES.

**X. FOCUS.** NOTIONS OR THINGS IN THE LODGE-CREATED ENVIRONMENT OF THE INDUCTION SEQUENCE MUST NOT DIVERT OR DISTRACT THE CANDIDATE'S ATTENTION, BUT DIRECT IT TO THE CENTRAL MEANING OF THE INDUCTION.

**XI. OBLIGATION TO UNIT.** THE FIRST OBLIGATION IN SCOUTING OF EVERY ARROWMAN IS TO HIS HOME UNIT.
