

Dear Brothers:

The past 48 years have seen many changes in the Order of the Arrow and in Octoraro Lodge. Today, ceremonies are quite different than before; boys, rather than adults, now

handle most lodge affairs; and different programs or aspects of the Order have been emphasized at different times. What does this mean? By itself, not much; but when you look at the other side of the coin, things begin to make sense. Consider the things that have not changed, that hopefully never will, the principles, ideals, and purpose of the Order of the Arrow. I think that it is important to note that, in an age where old customs die hard and where tradition is, more often than not, thought of as a hindrance; we have our roots in a tradition of principle rather than procedure. 


