- 4. Advance one rank in Scouting, i. e., First Class to Star, Star to Life, Life to Eagle, Eagle to Eagle Palm. Explorers may, if they wish, earn five or more merit badges.
- 5. Recruit, train, and follow through to see that one new boy becomes a Cub Scout, Boy Scout, or an Explorer. (This requirement must be certified by the new boy's unit leader)
