

HIGHLIGHTS OF SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER

Octoraro Lodge held its annual September Work Weekend on the last weekend of that month and it was a success. Many members attended and were able to accomplish much work on many necessary details including the Horse shoe road, sodding the parade field, cutting wood for the winter lodges, and the addition to the OA Lodge. Final physical preparations were made for the Section Council of Chiefs meeting which was scheduled for the following weekend.

In addition, 103 candidates successfully completed their ordeal and, as a result of Octoraro Lodge's expanded 50% Brotherhood Membership Drive, 59 Ordeal members met the requirements for that degree.

Then, on the 27th of October, the Lodge held its fall workday at the Council Service Center in West Chester. The continued beauty and overall appearance of the Service Center is possible because members gladly turn out, as evidenced by the workday, and do their part.

The yearly work weekends and workdays can continue to be a tremendous success with your support. A Golden Opportunity

If you have been in Octoraro Lodge (or any other lodge for that matter) for ten months or more you are eligible to become a Brotherhood member. By becoming a Brotherhood member you will seal your membership in our Lodge and you will also be doing your share in helping the Lodge reach its 50% Brotherhood membership goal. 50% Brotherhood membership is very important to our Lodge because it is the last requirement that we have to attain to apply for National Standard Lodge. National Standard Lodge is an award given to OA Lodges who meet certain requirements of excellence in the programs they conduct.

To become a Brotherhood Member you must:

 Be able to answer all of the questions on the questionnaire form which you received along with your handbook when you were inducted.

2. Hold active membership in Scouting.

Write a 100-300 word essay on your rededication to the principle of Cheerful Service to Fellowmen.

4. Hold active membership in the Lodge by showing a continued interest in Scouting and the Camping Program, and Service to the Order, through 3 Service Weekends and 2 Service Projects.

Fifty-nine (59) Ordeal members were inducted into the Brotherhood degree in September. The next opportunity to become Brotherhood is next April where we will be expecting a large number of candidates. So do your part for the Lodge and become Brotherhood in April.

- CAMPING EXPOSITION: To help lodges and companies set up their displays.
- AQUATICS: POOL & BOAT DOCK: Person must have at least Life Saving Merit Badge. Will be picked on basis of experience.
- FIELD SPORTS: ARCHERY & RIFLE RANGE: Need person with experience in setting up and running of Rifle and Archery Range.
- PROGRAM-MAINTENANCE: To help set up the up the various activities. Operate Quounset Hut.
- CHURCH SERVICES: In charge of making sure Chapel Hill and Kindness Center are clean and prepared. Will help the Chaiplain set up for respective service and assist in conducting service.

WONDERING WHAT TO DO WITH SOME OF YOUR SPARE TIME?

Matt Christenson has the perfect solution to that problem. Each weekend from November to the end of March, Octoraro Lodge sends a crew, consisting of one adult and 4 boys, down to Camp Horseshoe to spend the weekend. 
