These people are an important behind-the-scenes part of your Lodge as they are charged with the responsibility for all property and equipment over which the Lodge has use or control and the setting of rules and regulations governing the use of the building and equipment.

Your Lodge building serves an important function throughout the year besides the various OA weekends. Under the approval of the Trustees, it serves as the quarters for the OA crews servicing troops camping at Horseshoe during the winter weekend camping season. During the summer, the building is authorized to be used by the Trustees as a recreation spot for the Horseshoe staff and the troop leaders.

The Trustees meet periodically during the year to set plans for maintaining and improving your Lodge building. In recent years, projects included the addition of the Chief's room, storage room and kitchen partition, re-tiling of the bath and shower rooms, as well as adding attractive azalea and other decorative plantings on either side of the newly constructed entrance way. Other improvements include the reconstruction of the "Candidate's Wall" and erosion control.

As Octoraro Lodge moves towards its next 50 years of service, your elected Trustees will continue providing valuable service on the supervision of Octoraro 22's property and equipment.
