

The 1971-72 Executive Committee held its first meeting of the year in July at Camp Horseshoe. This meeting served as a kind of training session at which the new chairmen were made familiar with their duties and responsibilities as members of the committee. At the business portion of the meeting it was decided that we should cancel the separate Fall Fellowship Weekend since a conflict with another Council activity made it impossible to hold it on the weekend that had originally been planned on and since the alternate weekend would fall only two weeks before the regular Fall Ordeal Weekend. It was decided to hold the Fellowship in conjunction with the Ordeal, as was done last year. In discussing the proposed activities for the Weekend it was determined that the cost involved would prevent keeping the pool open for the weekend.

The first regular monthly meeting of the Executive Committee was held on September 19, 1971 at the Council Service Center. At this meeting some of the standing committees had reports on work that they had begun. The Ordeal Committee explained a new series of booklets which are given to candidates during the Ordeal. These booklets help the candidate gain a better understanding of the Ordeal and of the Order in general. These were used for the first time at the Fall Weekend. A sample of the new Lodge neckerchief design was passed around, this design was later approved at the meeting held at the Fall Fellowship. Discussion followed on possibilities for new projects and for ways in which the Lodge can improve in the coming year.
