Who's Who in the C.A.

Charles Milton Heistand came to Chester County as Scout Executive in 1923. Through his vision and foresight the Reynolds Farm near Rising Sun Maryland was purchased in 1927. During the next year he transformed this farm into one of the finest Boy Scout Camps in the East. Camp Horseshoe was dedicated on July 28, and still stands today as a monument to Chief Heistand.

In 1926 he was instrumental in organizing our Lodge. He became its first member and later its second Vigil member.

After leaving Chester County he served in Queens Council and Greater New York Council. In 1940 he was appointed Regional Executive of Region 2. In 1958, he was elevated to the position of Assistant Chief Scout Executive of the Boy Scouts of America.

We the present members of Octoraro Lodge are extremely proud of his accomplishments for the youth of America.
