The Horseshoe Trail District is searchin for one interested and hard working boy OA member from their district to be the camp promotions representative.

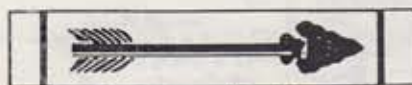

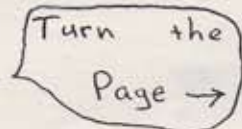
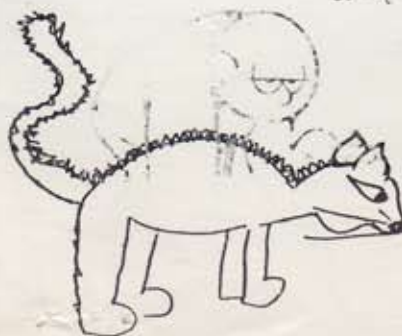
COMMITTEE POSITIONS
