The first through engaging Troops via an OA Troop Representative Training. That training was held at the April LEC Meeting – 20 different Troops sent a combination of OA Adult ASM's and youth OA Troop Representatives. The thought was that stronger communication between the Lodge and Troops of Chester County would enable the youth to engage in Lodge activities. We still could use everyone's assistance – if you are a member of a Troop that does not have an OA Troop Representative, ask the SPL and SM for that Troop position. Tell them that you want to be that person and are willing to carry out those duties and responsibilities.

The second phase was to conduct Troop Visitations. A list on Troops that were currently not participating in the Lodge or had low membership were contacted through a set of emails to the Troops SM's requesting some dates that the Officers and Advisors could visit. It has been a very busy last 2 months, traveling all over Chester County. The Lodge is closing that gap with still many more Troop Visitations planned and more follow up still necessary.

The third phase was to ensure the Unit Election team was hitting on all cylinders. That team has done outstanding work, receiving praises from numerous SM's on their professionalism and the team being great ambassadors for the Lodge. It is great to report that this Committee has grown in numbers to aid the many requests. I would like to personally thank them all as well – job well done.

The fourth and final phase was go back to a full-time Summer Camp Chief at Horseshoe Scout Reservation. I am happy to report Jack Wills has accepted that position and has already been trained on how to conduct Unit Elections by the Unit
