



Achgeketum Fire Circle Rehabilitation

While the Horseshoe Scout Reservation (HSR) is largely empty during the coronavirus pandemic, the Achgeketum Fire Circle is getting a major facelift that will make it both aesthetically and functionally improved for all our Scouts and guests. Thanks to the fundraising efforts of the 2019 Chester County Council Gala participants and a few organizations within CCC, including Octoraro Lodge 22, there are enough funds to get the initial phases of construction underway in the Winter and Spring of 2020. The gala was held in tribute of Ernie Heegard, longtime Horseshoe Camp Director and Octoraro 22 Lodge Adviser, and the proceeds from the gala were allocated to air circulation efforts at the Camp Horseshoe Dining Hall and rehabilitating the fire circle named after Ernie's Vigil Name: Achgeketum.

The functional improvements of the rehabilitation project include better water drainage management, direct guest access from the Boat Docks Road (rather than the sloped access walking trail at the South end of the circle), and bench lighting that will assist Scouts, Scouters, and guests to leave the circle safely at the end of an evening campfire. Speaking of benches - all benches have been replaced and now include cement slab anchoring across the entirety of each bench; the benches no longer lean forward and the anchoring should keep them completely vertical for a much longer time period. Large rock blocks also line the interior and exterior circles of Achgeketum giving it a very distinctive outline to further enhance its beauty.

Whenever we eventually head back to our beloved HSR, there will be a welcome surprise waiting for us at the North end of camp. In the meantime, keep your inner fire burning for Scouting until we can experience the Great Outdoors again together.
